The photos on the next page show some of the changes happening here in the physical space at Bethany.



The General Conference of the United Methodist Church was scheduled for May in Wisconsin. The COVID19 has caused the worldwide gathering of United Methodist Clergy and Laity to be postponed until 2021. The main topic of this General Conference was to decide to change the denomination into two. This decision will be moved until 2021. The General Conference meets every 4 years with delegates from each Annual Conference.

The Mountain Sky Annual Conference scheduled for Gillette, Wyoming will be totally on-line.

2020 DIGITAL ANNUAL CONFERENCE INFORMATION

Theme: Repairers of the Breach – Isaiah 58:9–12, "...you shall be called the repairer of the breach, the restorer of streets to live in."

<u>Format</u>: Limited digital platform using GNTV Media Ministry as a host, with Zoom Webinar as a platform.

<u>Schedule</u>: Friday, June 19 & Saturday, June 20 for the Digital Annual Conference Sessions.

<u>Worship</u>: Annual Conference will begin with worship, providing our spiritual grounding in Christ.

<u>Voting</u>: Secure ID numbers will be given after members are registered; links will be sent to use during sessions with items requiring a vote.

<u>Essential business</u>: Business sessions will include Clergy and Laity sessions, and a Plenary session. While clergy candidates will be approved during this session, ordination/commissioning will occur at Clergy Orders. The Memorial Service will be held at Clergy Orders as well.

<u>Registration</u>: Online registration will begin May 4 and is required for all voting members (to receive a voting ID); Worship will be a livestream that is open for anyone to view.

<u>Cost</u>: \$39 for all voting members (all clergy and laity, including equalization members) – this covers digital platforms and tech needs, as well as any mailing and printing costs.

<u>AC Information</u>: Petitions deadline is now May 10 and you can review the legislative process and download the template online; the deadline to send nominations for co-lay leader elections has been extended to May 10.
